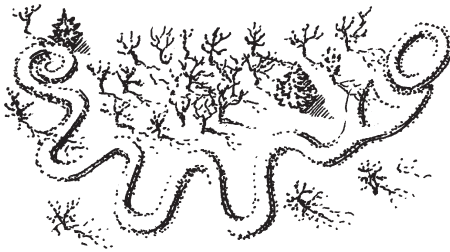


Lesson 2: Early American Cultures

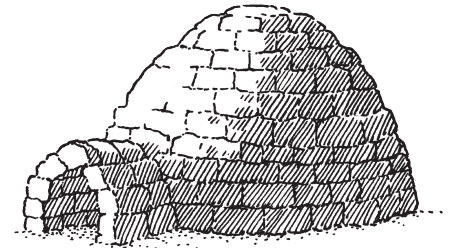
